Dear Hamasdegh Parent,

The PTA has been monitoring the news and information about COVID-19, as we are sure you have. While there are still relatively few cases in the DC area, it's likely there will be more confirmations every day. The safety, security, and well-being of our students and extended community are Hamasdegh School's top priorities. We continue to monitor the coronavirus developments closely and prepare ourselves for a variety of contingencies for the events planned for the rest of the school year. In particular, we have two major upcoming events -- Easter Breakfast on April 11 and Taline Concert on May 16. At this point, we have not canceled these events. But we will continue to monitor the situation closely and make a decision to postpone them in due course.

In a global pandemic, limiting the spread of the virus relies on everyone doing their part: following good personal hygiene, regular hand washing, and social distancing (at least 3 feet distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing). We as a community also want to exercise caution and follow some basic rules:

- If you or your child (or those with members of their household) have traveled to an area under the CDC's Travel Health Notice Level 2 or above, we kindly ask to not come to school for a period of time.
- If you or your child have symptoms such as fever, cough and body aches, we encourage you to avoid coming to church or participating in any church activity until 24 hours after symptoms have subsided.

Finally, if you feel uncomfortable about coming to church and school or if you or your child (or those with members of their household) have chronic medical conditions that may put you at higher risk, we encourage you to take the necessary steps to protect your loved ones including by staying home.

Update on costumes: The Armenian dance costumes for year-end hantes are continuing to come together nicely. In fact, some of the costumes are completed and ready to be delivered. Luckily, a family was ready to help with the transport of the finished costumes. We would like to express our deepest appreciation to the *Derthomasian* family for helping to bring some of the costumes back to the US. If you know someone who is traveling from Yerevan to Washington, DC in March or April and is willing to bring some of the costumes with them, please let us know.
