Have you ever wondered what your children learn in Armenian History class at Hamasdegh School? Last Sunday, the lower grades explored the Armenian story-telling tradition, with a focus on how narrative folk tales - in a time before widespread literacy - were so central to conveying culture, wisdom, and much more from generation to generation. Last Sunday's children's tale was "A Weave of Words," the Armenian story of an idle prince, the village girl who set him straight, and the victory they won together against a mean monster. The upper grades started last Sunday's class with a discussion of recent Artsakh developments, including Congressional visits, ANCA-backed legislative priorities, and the ProArtsakh conference that just finished in Stepanakert. The class ended with a sober review of past week's troubles in Syria, touching on the roots of the conflict in the past and the concerns about its future impact on Armenians and others.
