What kind of dances have your children been learning in class, and what is the approach? We asked *Alex Avaneszadeh*, the dance teacher at Hamasdegh School, to provide some insight. Thank you Alex and we are lucky to have you join our community!

"We often think of Armenian dance as choreographed and performed on stage, or something that we do during weddings, parties and social gatherings. Although this is true, my approach to teaching Armenian dance (*Azgagrakan Par*/Ethnographic Dance) is

focused on the fact that we are traditionally engaged in rituals through dance, equally as much as celebration and recreational fun. In class, we have been learning various categories of dances such as *Kocharis, Shorors* and *Gyovends*, which thus far include *Karno Kochari, Ver Veri, Shatakhi Gyovend, Karno Shoror* and *Tamzara*! Since these dances originated from the villages and regions of historic Armenia, we are learning about the spiritual and social symbolism of specific movements, the context in which these dances were engaged in, as well as ritualistic terminology, its history and its presence in Armenia and the diaspora. It has been an absolute pleasure teaching your children so far and happy to see them enjoying it!"
